However, the real deciding factor was when we were introduced to your local representative, Mr. John Bohr. John invited us to his Keystone home. He found us a local clearing company, foundation company, someone to do the basement floor, a plumber, and an electrician. All of his recommendations turned out to be first class choices. He helped us get all of our permits and inspections. Most of this was accomplished on the phone! I felt like I had a twenty four hours a day help line.

We were also greatly helped by our sales person, Sue Robson. Sue has the patience of a saint and was always willing to help us and advise us.
